Sefyllfa / Situation

To present Hywel Dda University Health Board's (HDdUHB's) reviewed Standing Orders (SOs) and Standing Financial Instructions (SFIs) against recently issued Model SOs and SFIs to the Audit and Risk Assurance Committee for consideration, prior to their onward submission to the Board for approval on 27 July 2023.

The most recently revised Model Standing Orders and Model Standing Financial Instructions were issued in accordance with the Minister for Health and Social Services' powers of direction in correspondence dated 7 April 2021, accompanied by a detailed breakdown of the amendments made. In line with this, HDdUHB's Standing Orders and Standing Financial Instructions were reviewed and updated to account for changes made to the Model versions and any local amendments, and were presented to the Board on 27 May 2021 and 28 July 2022.

Welsh Government has made no further amendments to its Model Standing Orders and Standing Financial Instructions; however, paragraph 11.0.2 of the Model Standing Orders states that these should be reviewed annually by Health Boards' and Trusts' Audit Committees, and any proposed amendments reported to the Board for consideration.

The reviewed HDdUHB Standing Orders and Standing Financial Instructions are therefore presented to the Audit and Risk Assurance Committee for comment, via the following hyperlink, prior to recommending their onward submission for approval to the Board on 27 July 2023.

It is necessary to ensure that Local Health Board, Trust, Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee (WHSSC) and Emergency Ambulance Services Committee (EASC) Model Standing Orders and Standing Financial Instructions are kept up to date and take account of

any developments, and NHS organisations in Wales are required to review their Standing Orders and Standing Financial Instructions against these Model Standing Orders and Standing Financial Instructions on an annual basis.

Standing Orders

As Welsh Government has made no further amendments to the Model Standing Orders issued in April 2021, following on from the previously agreed changes to the HDdUHB Standing Orders by the Board in May 2021 and July 2022, only the following local amendments are to be made:

- Throughout Amend the job title of the Board Secretary to the Director of Corporate Governance/Board Secretary.
- xx) replace the 'Doing Well, Doing Better: Standards for Health Services in Wales' Framework) with the Health and Care Quality Standards which were introduced as part of the Duty of Quality, in the Health and Social Care (Quality and Engagement) (Wales) Act 2020 ("the Act"), which came into force on 1 April 2023.
- 5.6.3 Change '5.6.3 The SRG's role is distinctive from that of <u>Community Health</u>
 <u>Councils (CHCs)</u>, who have a statutory role in representing the interests of patients
 and the public in their areas' to 'The SRG's role is distinctive from that of <u>Llais Cymru</u>,

The Health Board remains committed to working with Llais Cymru, who will continue to be invited to the Board and its Committees, whilst the Health Board awaits guidance from Welsh Government on the updates to the Model Standing Orders.

It is anticipated that amendments to the SOs relating to the Duty of Quality and the new citizen voice body, Llais Cymru, will be administered centrally from Welsh Government. Any prescribed amendments will be brought to the next available Audit and Risk Assurance committee after they have been issued.
