Sefyllfa / Situation

The purpose of this report is to update Audit & Risk Assurance Committee (ARAC) members regarding the Targeted Intervention (TI) meeting held with Welsh Government (WG) on 10 January 2024 and most recent correspondence from WG in relation to a change in escalation status from Enhanced Monitoring for Performance and Targeted Intervention for Planning and Finance to Targeted Intervention for the entire organisation (dated 23 January 2024).

Cefndir / Background

Targeted Intervention Meeting

The TI meeting was the fifth of a series of quarterly progress meetings with WG which had been scheduled following the TI Inception meeting held on 27 October 2022.

Information from this meeting is routinely shared with Board Members, ARAC and the Board in public session.

Joint Escalation and Intervention Arrangements Letter

Under the Joint Escalation and Intervention Arrangements, the WG meets with Audit Wales and Healthcare Inspectorate Wales twice a year to discuss issues, concerns and other related information concerning each health board, trust and special health authority. This information and other insights are considered alongside a detailed analysis of the health body by Welsh Government and decisions are then taken about the escalation status.

Updates were provided by the Health Board in respect of the following areas of TI and Enhanced Monitoring:

Health Board Opportunities Log

The Health Board presented the four key documents which constitute the Opportunities Log:

- Process and Principles Opportunities Framework
- Process and Principles Opportunities Exploration

- Project Initiation Document
- Savings Reporting Process and Principles

WG noted that four Health Boards are forecasting to deliver their control total and three are not. Of the three that are not, Hywel Dda UHB has proportionately the greatest deficit, and the least clarity about how it intends to address the issue. WG requested greater clarity and offered support prior to the next meeting on 30 April 2024.

 WG highlighted concerns regarding the Health Board's financial position; acknowledged the need for change; emphasised the importance of evidence-based delivery in TI meetings; the need for simplification; and an expectation for the Health Board to develop a clear route map to financial balance, which addresses the deteriorating financial deficit of the Health Board.

Finance

- WG noted that the likely deficit at Month 10 was expected to be in the region of £68m –
 69m against a control total of £44.8m. WG requested clarity on actions to address the
 forecast; and confirmation of the actions being undertaken and delivery expectation
 alongside timescale. WG also noted risks such as the upcoming industrial action and winter
 pressures.
- WG emphasised the need for careful management of cash choices, given the lack of funding cover.
- WG sought clarity on the overall expenditure run rate and future projections to establish
 clarity on the actions being taken to impact the overall run rate on a recurrent basis. WG
 confirmed that they would clarify the cash position by the end of January 2024.

Planning

- WG reiterated that they require a robust planning process, a credible plan in place, and the translation of the Clinical Services Strategy to the Clinical Services Plan.
- WG emphasised the importance of evidence of progress towards escalation, focussing on the Maturity Matrix, Action Plan, and the need for evidence supporting conclusions. on the Year 1 Assessment. WG colleagues require further validation and assessment.
- WG commended the progress made in the Clinical Services Plan over the past 12 months, requesting clarity regarding planning principles, planning assumptions, regional aspects, and the end point for each clinical service area and site within the Health Board.
- The Health Board confirmed it has not ruled out the possibility of offering opportunities to deliver services on behalf of the region; or collaborating with Swansea Bay UHB for more specialised work.
- The Health Board envisages a flexible approach that allows for both internal considerations and external collaboration.
- In respect of Stroke Services and an integrated planning approach considering service, workforce, and finance, the Health Board acknowledged the complexity of Stroke Services, and referenced ongoing assessments and the need for substantial improvements to meet standards. The Health Board also highlighted the potential cost savings and challenges associated with consolidating Stroke Services to one site, citing the geographical constraints and travel distances.
- The Health Board emphasised the need for service-specific discussions, clarifying that the process is not designed to provide definitive answers at this point.
- WG noted that a better financial position would enhance the Health Board's reputation.
- WG also noted that the Maturity Matrix, being a continuous assessment would never be complete. As a result, it should be formally presented to WG with supporting evidence at an agreed date after the end of the current planning round.

- WG expect to see a unified Opportunities Assessment which would inform the Clinical Services Plan and would address the opportunities available to the organisation across a range of service areas.
- WG agreed to share the final Nuffield review.

Enhanced Monitoring

- WG highlighted the trajectory for the year, acknowledging a deteriorating performance and referencing efforts to contain and mitigate it.
- The Health Board acknowledged the deteriorating Cancer Pathway performance, and expressed confidence in improvements, particularly in the Single Cancer Pathway, expecting a significant step change in performance by the end of December 2023.
- In terms of Planned Care, performance stood at 97.3% against the 97% target at the end of December 2023.
- Regarding Urgent and Emergency Care, WG noted a 50% improvement compared to the same period last year and emphasised the effectiveness of actions taken.
- WG noted improvements against Part 1A and Part 1B targets in Mental Health Services.
- The Health Board highlighted challenges in new developmental services and an anticipated deterioration in performance for the current month.
- On Critical Care, the Health Board is hopeful that the standard operating procedure (SOP)
 will be finalised shortly to support the temporary change to the service whilst the more
 detailed service plan is designed.
- In terms of C-Difficile (C-Diff) performance, WG noted that the Health Board had reported progress against the improvement plan, achieving a 13-infection reduction from predictions. The Health Board highlighted the introduction of a sporicidal, non-alcohol hand hygiene product and a new parasitic acid-based disinfectant contributing to reductions.

Letter from WG – Joint Escalation and Intervention Arrangements (Appendix 1) At the end of January 2024, following a recent meeting between WG, Audit Wales and Healthcare Inspectorate Wales and the widespread nature of concerns, the escalation status of the Health Board has been increased from enhanced monitoring for performance and targeted intervention for planning and finance to targeted intervention across the entire organisation (including finance, planning, leadership, governance, regional planning, quality improvements and operational delivery).

This decision reflects their concerns about the lack of sustained progress, over a period of time, on integrated planning, finance and delivery.

Welsh Government will continue to provide the necessary support and advice to address issues raised, including regular Joint Executive Team (JET) and Integrated Quality and Planning and Delivery Group (IQPD) meetings with subject specific discussions as and when considered necessary.

To date no further information has been provided to the Health Board regarding the detail under the headings.

The Health Board has taken up the offer of a Board briefing and this is scheduled for 22 February 2024.
