Sefyllfa / Situation

This paper provides the Audit & Risk Assurance Committee (ARAC) with an update on the University Health Board's (UHB) Escalation and Intervention Arrangements.

Cefndir / Background

In September 2016, as part of the Welsh Government's (WG) Escalation and Intervention Arrangements, the now Minister for Health and Social Services moved the UHB from Enhanced Monitoring to Targeted Intervention. This report provides an update on the recent change of status.

Asesiad / Assessment

The last Targeted Intervention (TI) meeting was held on 23rd July 2020, and an update report provided to ARAC at its last meeting held on 25th August 2020. The next TI meeting was due to be held on 30th September 2020, but was cancelled by Welsh Government (WG).

On 5th October 2020, the UHB received a letter from the Director General Health and Social Services/NHS Wales Chief Executive, advising that following the recent tripartite meeting (WG, Audit Wales and Healthcare Inspectorate Wales), WG would be recommending to the Minister that the UHB's escalation status was reduced from Targeted Intervention to Enhanced Monitoring; a copy is attached at Appendix 1. This was approved by the Minister for Health and Social Services.

This reduced escalation status was due to the UHB's continued good performance prior to COVID-19, and the group was complimentary regarding the UHB's response to the KPMG review. In order for the UHB to move into the lower escalation status of Routine Monitoring, the UHB must focus on future financial plans, dependent on delivering the clinical strategy.

The group raised some concerns and issues for consideration:

- Challenges still remain around the UHB's financial position and management;
- The need to ensure that appropriate planning capacity and leadership is in place recognising the significant commitments in the clinical strategy.

It is proposed to provide ARAC members with a six monthly assurance report on the progress with these areas.

In the meantime, WG will continue to provide the necessary specialised support and advice to address these issues raised, and will continue to hold Joint Executive Team (JET) and Quality and Delivery (Q&D) meetings when considered necessary.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our staff who have worked so diligently to allow this positive development to happen, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Joint Escalation and Intervention Arrangements

As you are aware, under the Joint Escalation and Intervention Arrangements, the Welsh Government meets with Audit Wales and Healthcare Inspectorate Wales twice a year to discuss the overall assessment of each health board and trust in relation to the arrangements.

A tripartite meeting has recently taken place and I write now to let you know your health board's status.

On the basis of the tripartite group discussion, Welsh Government officials will be recommending to the Minister that the escalation status of Hywel Dda University Health Board is reduced to 'enhanced monitoring'.

I would like to recognise the professional and considered way in which the NHS and your organisation has responded to the extraordinary circumstances of the pandemic response. I would also like to thank you and your team on the work you did in relation to the setting up of Field Hospitals across Wales. This has been an important initiative in dealing with COVID.

The group was complimentary on the way you had responded to the KPMG review. In order for the health board to move into routine monitoring, the group felt that there was a need for the organisation to focus on future financial plans, which will be dependent on delivering the clinical strategy.

Despite the de-escalation, some concerns and issues were raised by the group for you to consider and improve upon, namely:

- Challenges still remain around the health board's financial position and management;
- The need to ensure that appropriate planning capacity and leadership is in place recognising the significant commitments in the clinical strategy.

In the meantime, Welsh Government colleagues will continue to provide the necessary specialised support and advice to address issues raised. We will continue to have regular JET and Q&D meetings with subject specific discussions as and when considered necessary.
