Sefyllfa / Situation

This report is presented to the Health and Safety Committee (HSC) to provide a summary of the Security Management Review and will provide an overview of the Planning Objective 3L progress and closure report for 2022/23.

Cefndir / Background

The Security review was undertaken to establish a baseline level of compliance against specific security management arrangements. Including physical systems, process and personnel.

The Planning Objective 3L stated that by 31st March 2023 a review of the existing security arrangements within the Health Board would be undertaken with particular reference to strengthening the following areas:

- Physical Security
- Automated locks
- CCTV
- Access Control Systems
- Intruder Alarms
- Communication Systems
- Human Factors
- Patient and Staff Personal Property
- Local Management and staff ownership

The Security Review paper has been discussed with the Executive Team with the aim of raising awareness of the security risks to the organisation and where possible to seek support in improving security management across the Board.

Asesiad / Assessment

The review has identified positives in terms of individual staff who contribute on a daily basis in ensuring other staff, patients and the organisation is as secure and safe as they reasonably can.

This is demonstrated by Portering staff, Facilities Supervisory, Information Technology staff, Violence and Aggression Case Manager and the Security Adviser.

Positives have also been recognised with many departments and hospital sites having access control systems in place to secure and restrict access where appropriate.

The recent Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) project to improve the quality and access to the Accident and Emergency and Minor Injury Units has been welcomed. Work will start on the extensive upgrade during March 2023.

Another positive is the appointment of a dedicated Health Board Security Adviser and due to slight changes to this role the individual should be able to focus their commitment to the security agenda and the work that will be required over the next three years. In line with a Health Board Security Management Framework.

There is still a considerable amount of work to be progressed to enable improvement and upgrades within existing provision. The report highlights a number of areas where compliance with legislation and general ownership and management of process requires better coordination and clarity in roles.

In particular, whilst access control systems are in place, the management of each needs to be improved. The report highlights the need to integrate, wherever possible, the existing systems and to identify individuals or departments to manage these processes.

The process for the issue and retrieval of Staff Identity cards is also highlighted with the future need to integrate access control permissions onto the cards. Again, a more joined up and coordinated approach is required with this basic but essential security management measure.

The report covers use of our Portering staff security duties and recommends approaches to improve their safety and potential longer-term security response arrangements.

There is still work to be undertaken regarding intruder alarms and in particular safe response to any alarm activations particularly from community settings. This is work the Security Adviser will be reviewing during March 2023.
