Sefyllfa / Situation

This report provides a further update to the Health and Safety Committee (HSC) on the initial reporting information made available by the new Fire Safety Audit System Report (Boris).

This is the first opportunity for the Hywel Dda University Health Board (HDdUHB) to review all risk assessment outcomes by category in an electronic format.

Cefndir / Background

The Health Board has recently introduced a new online software system to both accurately record the findings of all Fire Safety Risk Assessments (FRA) and importantly determine appropriate ownership to escalate and manage the significant findings. This mechanism is clearly articulated as part of our approved Fire Safety Policy.

The Boris system boasts many advanced features such as handheld tablet data gathering and data entry of FRA's, moving totally away from the older paper-based system. Also advanced reporting and interrogating of data, including ownership of FRA actions across the entire Health Board.

We have also worked closely with the Boris developers to produce a detailed risk dashboard to offer a greater level of visibility of risk and increased assurance. This data is now being used by all fire safety sub-groups across the Health Board to communicate the necessary actions.

The following assessment section of this report aims to at this stage set out the statistical analysis of Estates Led Extreme and High-Risk items within the Boris system:

For these risks, we have also, as part of a detailed review categorised them into the following key areas:

- Risks already covered by an agreed programme of works with Mid and West Wales Fire Service (MWWFRS).

- Risks covered by the reduction of scope (Agreed by MWWFRS).
- Risks that require additional funding.
- Risks managed by Site Operations Teams.
- Risks managed by General Managers.

Asesiad / Assessment

The Boris system has been developed to ensure that risk criteria scores match the Health Board's own risk score system which are:

- Extreme (15-25)
- High (8-12)
- Moderate (4-6)
- Low (0-3)

All risks within the system will either be managed by Estates and Facilities (building fabric, structural etc) or General Managers (housekeeping issues, storage, fire doors wedged open etc).

All risks have been assigned to a specific individual so there is total clarity and accountability.

The following tables below (Table 1.0 and Table 2.0) have been included to provide an overview of the current number of estates risks recorded in the system for Extreme and High-Risk categories.

Furthermore Table 3.0 provides an overview of all risks assigned to General Managers

A summary report identifying all of the above statistical analysis of risks has been added to the Agenda for the Operational Planning, Governance and Performance Meeting (OPGP).

Note: We have recently experienced some technical issues with the Boris system and we are working closely with the developers to rectify this.

The issue is in relation to archiving older fire risk assessments from the system to avoid duplication of risk actions. The Boris developers have confirmed this will be addressed in early September. On this occasion the data has been extracted and manually calculated to produce these totals.
