The Mental Health Legislation Committee to be assured that the work undertaken by the Power of Discharge Sub Committee during the quarter are carried out correctly.

Cefndir / Background

This Report provides in respect of the work that has been undertaken by the Power of Discharge Sub-Committee during the quarter, that those functions of the Mental Health Act 1983 (the Act), as amended are being carried out correctly; and that the wider operation of the 1983 Act in relation to the Local Health Board's area is operating properly.

The hospital managers must ensure that patients are detained only as the Act allows, that their treatment and care fully comply with it, and that the patients are fully informed of, and are supported in exercising, their statutory rights. Hospital managers must also ensure that a patient's case is dealt with in line with other legislation which may have an impact, including the Mental Capacity Act 2005, the Human Rights Act 1998 and the Data Protection Act 1998.

	Richard Griffith discussed the proposed changes to the Mental Health Act, and confirmed that hospital managers appeal hearings will be remaining, a lot of the changes that the new bill will bring will be in insuring more equity and parity with better justification for the use of detention, a lot of training will need to take place once the final changes are confirmed.

	It was highlighted that the number of applications were similar to that of last year. The renewals hearing were considerably lower this quarter.	

During this quarter, patients were being given the option of whether they would like their hearing held face to face or via MS teams. We believe the Health Board, is the first in Wales to return to face to face hospital managers hearings. Some health boards in Wales have yet to return to face to face hearings.

MHRT's still conduct hearings remotely but have confirmed F2F will resume in Spring 2023. This has impacted the hospital managers as its been reported in a recent case a patient was unable to participate fully in the MHRT process so opted to apply for a hospital managers review.

Natasha confirmed that the feedback they have received is that patients are satisfied with having the option of how their hearing is being held.

Delyth Raynsford raised the issue of hearings being held in Welsh, as there had been no requests in the last quarter for welsh hearings, Ruth confirmed that patients always have the option to request hearings in welsh, however this is a very rare occurrence

Some issues were raised with regards to the technology used in virtual hearings and the difficulties that occur when there are a number of people attending from the same room.

	The feedback from patients is that they are reluctant to appeal to the MHRT as there is no option for a face to face hearing.
