ADRODDIAD SCAA SBAR REPORT Sefyllfa / Situation

The UK Government has appointed a Joint Committee of the House of Commons and House of Lords to call for evidence seeking views about the Draft Mental Health Bill prior to it being formally introduced at some point in 2023.

Cefndir / Background

An independent review report of the Mental Health Act 1983 made 154 recommendations covering reform to legislation, policy and practice is referred to as the Wessely report. The Governments response to this was published in its White Paper 'Reforming the Mental Health Act' in January 21. A subsequent consultation was undertaken and reported on in July 2021.

Assesiad / Assessment

Respondents were overall supporting on the proposals set out in the Reform document and it takes forward a majority of the recommendations. This includes putting service users at the centre of decisions about their care.

Some of the main recommendations are below:

Use of the MHA for people with autism and learning disability

People with LD and/or autism will only be able to be detained under Section 3 if they meet the criteria that they are suffering from a co-occurring mental disorder which is not LD or autism. This seems to end stays on long-stay wards which often do not provide any therapeutic benefit.

Grounds for detention

People will only be detained under certain sections if they pose a risk of serious harm to either themselves or others and will need to fulfil specific criteria to meet the threshold for detention. This new risk criteria will also apply to CTO patients

New role of Nominated Person

This will be a new statutory role to the MHA and the Nominated Person will replace the nearest relative. Patients will have the ability to personally select a Nominated person as opposed to the current hierarchical list of relatives which must be identified by the Approved Mental Health Professional. A NP will be able to represent the patient and be more involved in aspects of the patients care.

Change in Detention Periods

Some detention periods will be shortened along with their review periods. This in turn will mean that patients will have more frequent rights of appeal to the Mental Health Review Tribunal for Wales or referral to Welsh Ministers by the hospital managers for certain patients. The Bill also proposes amendments to extend the period in which patients may apply and widen the group of patient who would have automatic referrals.

Appropriate medical treatment and making treatment decisions

A new requirement will require any medical treatment to be of therapeutic benefit to the patient and will also be applicable to CTO patient. Encouragement is to be sought from patients to make participate in treatment decisions and to take people close to patients and ensure that clinical decisions are based around patient's wishes.

Community Treatment Orders

There will be a requirement for there to be a consultation between the inpatient and community clinicians regarding the use and operation of CTOs including decisions to recall and discharge patients enhancing professional oversight.

The Bill also proposes that services in England will align with Wales with respect to Care and Treatment Plans are wider access to Independent Mental Health Advocacy.
