The UHB provides below, information on why referrals may be rejected.

Specialist (S-CAMHS) are focused on the provision of Mental Health Services (MHS) for children and young people (CYP). During the years requested, S-CAMHS maintained the same criteria. However, the service experienced a drop in the number of referrals received in quarter 1 of the 2020/21 financial year due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Although this was the case, S-CAMHS has continued to increase their digital footprint; implementing Attend Anywhere as part of the UHB's directive, which has allowed for timely virtual video calls; S-CAMHS also developed a contract with Kooth, an online counselling platform, which has been, and continues to be, offered to all young people waiting for intervention across the service and are offered support at time of rejected referral; other developments include both Consultant Connect and Silvercloud.

S-CAMHS Service Specification was in operation in 2018 and continues to be in 2024, this sets out the operational standards including referral criteria as set by Welsh Government (WG) for S-CAMHS (Primary and Secondary Mental Health services) in 2020 "Framework for Improvement" NHS Wales Specialist CAMHS Service Framework CAREMORE, reissued in 2021.

Within the UHB, where a referral does not meet the criteria for a MHS, the S-CAMHS Single Point of Contact clinician would provide advice, support, and signpost to a more relevant agency such as school counselling or Third Sector support. Local Authorities (LAs) and education have been allocated funding to address low level emotional support and wellbeing, this includes substantial funding to expand the School Counselling Services.

Additionally, some referrals are not accepted as they haven't had a first line intervention (such as a school counsellor). Others aren't accepted because they haven't consented to the referral, don't wish to attend a service, or because another service would be more appropriate (such as due to social need). S-CAMHS are also able to provide consultations to school staff who may be best able to support the CYP in school.
