Policy Title:	NHS Wales Prior Approval Policy – January 2017

Brief Aims and Objectives of Policy:

Health Board's in Wales have a responsibility to secure services for their patients. Patients registered with a GP in Wales who are resident in Wales do not have a statutory right to choose which hospital they are referred to. The Welsh Governments view is that in general, Health Boards can best organise services to meet the needs of their patients when such services are provided in Wales. This ensures equity in terms of access, convenience, and affords each Health Board the opportunity to strengthen and improve the quality of their local services thus providing a net gain for the whole community

The aim of the policy will be met through the following objectives:

- To provide clarity for referring clinicians and patients on the decision making process for Prior Approval for Out of Area Referrals
- To provide a clear governance framework for the decision making of Prior Approval for an Out of Area Referral on behalf of a patient.
- To provide a clear procedure for challenge and appeal.

This position is reinforced by legal challenges made to the Court of Appeal who have defended the right of the NHS to apply such policies and that their impact (when applied properly) is not discriminatory. There is no indication that this differs on a locally applied basis within Hywel Dda University Health Board. The "Independent Review of the Individual Patient Funding Requests Process in Wales" report was published in January 2017 and made a number of recommendations to support the IPFR process. This includes the development of a clear and consistent national process for dealing with requests to access routine services outside of Local Health Board's existing arrangements. This has resulted in an All Wales NHS Prior Approval Policy document.				
	As each Health Board had previously had their own Prior Approval Policy, the IPFR Networking Group were of the opinion that moving to a All Wales Policy would have a neutral impact on protected groups. The new policy will be subject to a consultation period. Any issues arising in relation to equality, diversity or human rights during the consultation will be noted in the equality impact assessment review and action taken to eliminate or mitigate any potential disadvantage.
