	PG raised that it would be helpful to have a workshop theme that focused on preparing proposals in advance to ensure that the funding proposals are co-produced as the Welsh Government timelines do not always allow this. PG suggested another workshop theme 'Establishing recovery principles throughout the work we do.'					
	Mental Health Service Improvement Funding

	WL updated that health boards in Wales received a letter from Welsh Government setting out funding allocation for Mental Health Service Improvement Funding, Specialist CAMHS Funding and Crisis Care.					

## **Mental Health Service Improvement Funding**

PG highlighted that it is very important that service user and carers are involved with the funding proposals and suggested that the feedback questions could be written and collated by service users. PG raised that the outcomes of the funding proposals should be about reducing the need for the service user rather than outputs of the service. PG highlighted that in one of the S-CAMHS funding proposals there is mention of 'including better knowledge of eating disorders' which is not applicable to some of the bids, AF apologised and will amend accordingly.

## Action: AF to amend 'including better knowledge of eating disorders' in the appropriate funding proposals

AD asked if the bids submitted exceed the total amount allocated. JL updated that the funding proposals have exceeded the total amount allocated in case some proposals are not approved by Welsh Government. JL added that there is short term slippage available if needed. AD suggested that the LMHPB could prioritise the funding proposals and queried if the funding is recurrent. JL confirmed that the funding is recurrent.

LC updated that last year there were bids that did not meet the priority list and were brought forward for this year. The funding proposals this year reflect current pressure points and need to be prioritised such as S –CAMHS. AD thanked LC and highlighted that it can be difficult as a stakeholder to express what needs to be prioritised, only to see that a funding proposal was not submitted based on expressions. LC updated that additional recurrent funding of £200,000 for tier 0/1 services and that a meeting has been arranged with partners to discuss. AD highlighted that stakeholder lived experience perspectives need to be included on the wider mental health developments and Welsh Government do not allow enough time for these to be captured in the process. AD added that she has had to go back to stakeholders and explain that their perspective on mental health development could not influence the final decision on which funding proposals should be prioritised and submitted. LC thanked AD for highlighting the above and agreed that a planning function across agencies needs to be developed. WL highlighted that the tight time scales for bids is raised continuously at the National Partnership Board. JH suggested to set up a process that looks at all the priorities and funding for mental health and suggested to push back on Welsh Government surrounding the priorities set out.

LC updated that at the fortnightly Welsh Government Leads meeting she raised that the 111 allocation would not allow the health board to provide a robust service. LC added that she received a phone call from who advised us to submit a bid to Welsh Government to meet the needs of a robust 111 service and explain why the funding proposal is over the allocated funds. TD noted that if Welsh Government are aware of the transformation of mental health services, they would understand why Hywel Dda University Health Board are pushing back on some priority areas.
