### **Requested:**

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request the following information please:-

Documentation regarding the application and proposed relocation of DDAS (Dyfed Drug and Alcohol Services) from Vaughan Street above Boots in Llanelli Town Centre to Anchor Point building in North Dock.

Specifically:-

- A list of alternative locations which have been considered as part of the relocation process
- A copy of the risk assessment carried out for any proposed relocation to North Dock
- A copy of the community impact survey undertaken for any proposed relocation to North Dock

### **Response:**

Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) is currently in the planning stages of developing a wellness centre in Llanelli which is intended to house the Community Drug and Alcohol Teams (CDAT), Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS), Smoking Cessation Service and the wider Public Health Team, in addition to providing a facility for the Dyfed Drug and Alcohol Service.

Documentation regarding the application and proposal for the project can be accessed via the Carmarthenshire County Council Planning website, using reference number PL/05250. - All Saints Church, Goring Road

- Fire Damaged Church, Murray Street
- Shop, Upper Station Road
- Bengal Lancer, Murray Street
