Response:

1. Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) provides within the table overleaf, the number of patients treated with the Fibrinogen Concentrate (FC) blood product and the units used for the brands listed, during the period 1 October 2024 to 30 September 2025.

2. The UHB does not hold the information exactly as requested as it cannot differentiate between pooled and single units. Additionally, the UHB is unable to provide you with the number of patients, due to the low number of cases (less than 5), as there is a potential risk of identifying individuals if this was disclosed. Therefore, the UHB is withholding these details under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FoIA).

This information is protected by the Data Protection Act 2018 (DPA)/UK General Data Protection Regulations (UK GDPR), as its disclosure would constitute unfair and unlawful processing and would be contrary to the principles and articles of the UK GDPR. This exemption is absolute and therefore, there is no requirement to apply the public interest test.

In reaching this decision, the DPA and UK GDPR define personal data as data that relates to a living individual who can be identified solely from that data or from that data and other information, which is in the possession of the data controller.

However, the UHB can confirm that five (5) units of the blood product Cryoprecipitate was used during the period 1 October 2024 to 30 September 2025.
