Response:

 Hywel Dda University Heath Board (UHB) confirms a breastfeeding support service is provided in-house. From March 2018, breastfeeding support clinics have been provided once a week in the Midwife Led Units at Glangwili General Hospital (GGH) and Withybush General Hospital (WGH).

Approximately one hundred (100) to two hundred (200) mothers access the support services at each hospital annually.

Between 2014 and 2019, the breastfeeding support service was provided by two (2) infant feeding co-ordinators and a lactation consultant for the two (2) clinics per week.

- 3. The UHB confirms for the period requested, no funding has been provided for breastfeeding support services. Breastfeeding support groups across the three (3) counties have been led by unpaid counsellors and voluntary peer supporters and/or health visitors.
