## <u>Response</u>:

 Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) confirms that the target timescales that medical practitioners are required to provide a diagnosis for those suspected of having Dementia are detailed within its Memory Assessment Service (MAS) Specification - 1043 version 1. The specific wording is as follows:

'All MAS teams aim to:

- Offer assessment within 28 days of referral
- Provide a diagnosis within 12 weeks of referral'

The UHB reports the timescales above to the Improvement Cymru for All Wales Dementia Care Pathway of Standards (standard 6) and West Wales Care Partnership.
