- 3. In the past 2 years how many employees have been disciplined for inappropriate access to patient data (broken down by digital and paper records).
- 4. What percentage of your total employed or contracted staff are compliant with any nationally available mandated Data Protection training?
- 5. How many employees do you have that are directly responsible for providing advice on matters of Data Protection and Confidentiality.
- 6. How many Subject Access Requests have you received from patients over the past 12 months.

Response:

 Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) has applied an exemption under Section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FoIA), as the information requested is accessible by another means. The UHB has answered a similar Freedom of Information request, FOI.12082.23 -Contact details, which is already within the public domain and is available on our disclosure log.

- 2. The UHB confirms that it uses the National Intelligent Integrated Audit Solution (NIIAS), which is used on a daily basis and has been for the previous twelve (12) month period.
- 3. The UHB does not hold the information exactly as requested, as it does not distinguish between paper and digital records. However, the UHB confirms that twelve (12) employees have been disciplined for inappropriately accessing patient records, during the period 1 November 2022 to 31 October 2023.
- 4. The UHB confirms that 77.4% of its employees were compliant with the Information Governance training requirements, as at 15 November 2023.

- 5. The UHB confirms that it has 12 members of staff that are directly responsible for providing advice on matters of Data Protection and confidentiality.
- 6. The UHB confirms that it has received 3,804 Subject Access Requests (SARs) from patients, during the period 1 October 2022 to 30 September 2023.
