Requested:

- 1. Does the Health Board currently commission an ear wax removal service or services within primary care or community ear care services, available to <u>all</u> patients registered with GP practices within the Health Board's boundary, as per <u>Welsh Government's Ear Wax Management Primary and Community Care Pathway (WHC/2020/014)?</u>
- 2. If it does, how can a patient access this service or services when it is considered clinically necessary and/or self-care advice, if appropriate, has been unsuccessful?
- 3. If the Health Board does commission this service or services within primary care or community ear care services, please provide the name or names of those commissioned providers.
- 4. Does the Health Board have a policy or guidance on ear wax removal and/or referral pathways for its primary care providers for patients for whom the benefit of ear wax removal is clinically indicated?
- 5. If the Health Board has issued such guidance, please provide a copy.

Response:

- 1. Hywel Dda University Heath Board (UHB) confirms that it has community ambulatory nurse led clinics for ear wax removal. Additionally, if a patient has an NHS hearing aid and the wax is affecting their ability to use their hearing aid/s, they can also be seen by the Audiology Service.
- 2. The UHB confirms that the service is accessed via its self-referral information hub or by telephone. The details are provided below:

- 3. The UHB confirms the community ambulatory nurse led clinics for ear wax removal are provided by UHB staff.
