## Requested:

We would like to request the answers to the below questions, in relation to your endoscopy services at the hospitals.

- 1. How many patients do you have on the endoscopy waiting list?
- 2. What is the name of the endoscopy lead who oversees the endoscopy decisions?
- 3. How many scopes are you processing per week?
- 4. Are you planning any refurbishments, decants or expansions to the endoscopy department to expand or improve the services this year?
- 5. What are the typical issues you are experiencing within endoscopy services?
- 6. Have you ever used or considered using a mobile endoscopy unit and if so which one?
- 7. If you were to look at a mobile endoscopy unit, would you require staffing?
- 8. Do you currently use insourcing for your endoscopy lists and if so who do you use?
- 9. Do you have a contingency plan if you experience a disaster situation or the endoscopy unit is unusable?

## Response:

- 1. Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) confirms that it has two thousand two hundred and fifty-eight (2,258) patients on the active Gastrointestinal (GI) Endoscopy waiting list, as at 12 February 2024.
- The UHB's Endoscopy decisions are overseen by the Managerial Lead Sara Edwards, Service Delivery Manager, Endoscopy & Gastroenterology and the Clinical Leads Faiz Ali, Consultant Gastroenterologist and Dafydd Bowen, Consultant Gastroenterologist.
- 3. The UHB confirms that approximately two hundred and sixty-eight (268) GI scopes are processed across the UHB per week.
- 4. The UHB confirms that there are no plans in place for any refurbishments, decants or expansions to the Endoscopy Department to expand or improve the services this year.
- 5. The UHB confirms that the issues experienced within the Endoscopy Service are a backlog of patients on the waiting list, workforce fragility and recruitment challenges, the capacity to meet growing demand and bowel screening optimisation and the effects on growing demand.
- 6. The UHB confirms that it has never used and has not considered using a mobile endoscopy unit.

- 8. The UHB confirms that it does not use insourcing for its Endoscopy lists.
- 9. The UHB confirms that it does have a business continuity plan in place.
