- a. Are there key tasks which your providers still do manually which could benefit from digitisation?
- 2. Are your providers able to easily access GP and Social Care information via digital platforms?

- 3. Do your network's providers have the underlying infrastructure in place to support these digital capabilities?

Response:

- 1. Yes, Hywel Dda University Health Board's (UHB) network's providers use digital capabilities to perform key tasks.
- a. Yes, the UHB has key tasks that remain manual, which include clinical observations, patient flow and clinical documentation (although nursing documentation is now digital).
- Yes, the UHB and its providers can easily access GP records via digital platforms. The UHB is currently deploying the Welsh Community Care Information System which is partially available for Social Care.
- 3. The UHB confirms that no assessment has been undertaken.

4. The UHB recently completed a Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) assessment and the percentage achievement against the Electronic Medical Record Adoption Mode (EMRAM) is provided below:

Acute – 39% Analytics – 38% Outpatient – 26%

- 5. Yes, the UHB's strategic plans prioritise the optimisation of digital capabilities.
- 6. The UHB confirms that it has partial robust controls in place to mitigate cyber risk and protect patient confidentiality, with work ongoing as part of compliance with the Network and Information System Regulations
