Requested:

Further to the response to FOI 5926, I have been advised that 149 did not receive their second vaccination within 12 weeks.

Therefore:

- 1. Of those 149 how many were patients of the Narberth practice?
- 2. Of those 149 what was the longest timescale delay solely caused by the GPs and not due to the recipients own failure to attend?

Response:

- 1. Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) confirms that of the one hundred and forty nine (149) patients that did not receive their second Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccination within 12 weeks, seven (7) were registered to Narberth Surgery.
- The UHB regrets to inform you that it is unable to provide you with details of the longest wait for a second Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine, where the reason for delay was caused by a GP, not non-attendance, as this information is not recorded on the UHB's Welsh Immunisation System (WIS).

Whilst operating in accordance with Section 45 of the Freedom of Information Code of Practice, the UHB has a duty to provide advice and assistance. Therefore, the UHB can confirm that the longest wait to receive a second Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine was sixteen (16) weeks, as recorded on WIS, although the reason for the wait is not recorded.

However, individual GP Practices may have their own methods of recording this information, which the UHB does not have access to. We therefore suggest that you contact the surgeries directly for this information, as they may be able to help you further with your request.
