Hywel Dda University Health Board (UHB) has provided a breakdown of its performance of symptomatic breast referrals against the two week referral to treatment time target for urgent suspected cancer cases. The patients included within the 'removed without treatment' category refers to patients who were referred but subsequently removed from the waiting list due to no longer requiring treatment for various reasons including being treated elsewhere.

The UHB is therefore withholding this detail under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This information is protected by the Data Protection Act (DPA) 2018 / General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) 2016, as its disclosure would constitute unfair and unlawful processing and would be contrary to the principles and articles 6 and 9 of the GDPR. This exemption is absolute and therefore there is no requirement to apply the public interest test.
