However, the Mid and West Wales Suicide and Self Harm Prevention Forum is currently developing its regional action plan and has held a series of workshops to identify its priorities. Although veterans have not been identified as a specific priority group, the work to support suicide prevention within the veterans' community will be embedded through the other priority areas, including involving those with lived experience of being bereaved by suicide.
