Sefyllfa / Situation

The performance report incorporates COVID-19 elements and focuses primarily on Hywel Dda University Health Board's (HDdUHB) key deliverable areas. As in previous months, this report is being brought to the Board's attention to examine and consider HDdUHB's latest available performance data, achievements, risks, impact and actions during the COVID-19 pandemic. This update consists of:

- A new section for COVID-19 vaccinations.
- Executive summary.
- COVID-19 one page summary of key points.
- Key performance areas overview.
- Essential service update a one page summary of services maintaining Welsh Government (WG) operating framework compliance.
- Themed updates for key deliverables.


Asesiad / Assessment

- **COVID-19 vaccinations** as at 14th January 2021, a total of 14,353 people were vaccinated in Hywel Dda. In line with Welsh Government policy, we are currently vaccinating priority groups 1 and 2. The percentages of these groups vaccinated as at 14th January were:
 - 1) Residents in a care home for older adults and their carers 17.2%.
 - 2) All those 80 years of age and over and frontline health and social care workers 20.0%.

A locality map is currently being developed and will be provided for future meetings.

COVID-19 update

From the start of the pandemic to 31st December 2020, there has been a total of 11,451 confirmed cases of COVID-19 for Hywel Dda residents, of which 54% (6,192) were confirmed during December 2020.



Unscheduled care – the overall performance trend for the four unscheduled care metrics
continued to decline in December 2020, with red calls reporting the poorest performance
since October 2015.

- **Planned care** for the first time since the pandemic was declared, there was an improvement in the number of breaches (-603) for referral to treatment (RTT) within 36 weeks from 25,785 in November 2020 to 25,182 in December 2020.
- **Neurodevelopment and Psychological services** as at 30th November 2020, there were 1,185 children waiting over 26 weeks for a neurodevelopment assessment and 1,226 adults waiting over 26 weeks for a psychological therapy.


Cancer

- During November 2020, 79 out of 113 (70%) urgent suspected cancer patients commenced treatment within 62 days, considerably below the 95% target. The requirement for cancer patients to self-isolate pre-treatment continues to impact on performance across Wales.
- The 98% target for non-urgent suspected cancer patients was narrowly missed (97.3%) with 108 out of 111 patients being treated within 31 days from their treatment date being agreed.
- **Therapies** therapy wait breaches have been consistently reducing each month, from 1,613 in June 2020 to 415 in December 2020.

Stroke


 The percentage of patients admitted to a stroke unit within 4 hours declined to 26.8%, our poorest performance for over 3 years, with the lowest performance at Glangwili General Hospital (9.1%).





 The target for stroke patients to be seen within 24 hours by a stroke consultant has been consistently met throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

- **Healthcare acquired infections (HCAI)** the targets have not been met for Clostridioides difficile (C.difficile), Escherichia coli (E.coli) and Staphylococcus aureus (S. aureus). However, when compared to the same period in 2019/20, year-to-date improvements have been made:
 - C.diff cases reduced by 11%
 - E.coli cases reduced by 24%
 - S.aureus cases reduced by 20%.
