# ADRODDIAD SCAA SBAR REPORT

### Sefyllfa / Situation

The purpose of this report is to update the Board on relevant matters undertaken as Chief Executive of Hywel Dda University Health Board (the UHB) since the Board meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> May 2022.

### Cefndir / Background

This report provides the opportunity to present items to the Board to demonstrate areas of work that are being progressed and achievements that are being made, which may not be subject to prior consideration by a Committee of the Board, or may not be directly reported to the Board through Board reports.

### Asesiad / Assessment

### (1) Register of Sealings

The UHB's Common Seal has been applied to legal documents and a record of the sealing of these documents has been entered into the Register kept for this purpose. The entries at **Appendix A** have been signed by the Chair and Chief Executive or the Deputy Chief Executive (in the absence of the Chief Executive) on behalf of the Board (Section 8 of the UHB's Standing Orders refers).

### (2) Consultations

The UHB receives consultation documents from a number of external organisations. It is important that the UHB considers the impact of the proposals contained within these consultations against its own strategic plans, and ensures that an appropriate corporate response is provided to highlight any issues which could potentially impact upon the organisation. A status report for Consultation Documents received and responded to is detailed at **Appendix B**, should any Board Member wish to contribute.

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# (3) Strategic and Operational Issues: local and regional

### Ros Jervis, former Director of Public Health

It is with great sadness that I record that Ros Jervis, our recently retired Director of Public Health, passed away on 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022, at home. Our thoughts are with her family and friends. Ros retired from the UHB in April 2022, to enable her to spend time with her family while she received treatment for her illness.

Ros was a consummate professional, but importantly too, she was a cheerful and heart-warming individual who brought light and joy to any situation. As I have said previously, she will be a great loss to us all in the UHB, but I know that her legacy will live within our communities for decades.

Ros requested that trees are planted in her memory, and the UHB is working with her family to make appropriate arrangements.

### Continuing Healthcare (CHC) and Funded Nursing Care (FNC) fee uplift

Members are invited to note the Continuing Healthcare (CHC) and Funded Nursing Care (FNC) fee uplift for 2022/23, which has been agreed following an engagement process with Local Authority partners and follows the extant approach previously agreed by the Board.

This year, the uplift also reflects the requirement to meet the Real Living Wage standard, as set out by Welsh Government in response to the inflationary pressures and cost of living crisis facing many of our Providers. At this stage, the uplift for FNC is interim, and is subject to final details of the nationally agreed Pay Award. Any adjustment arising from that process will be made once further details are known.

In conjunction with Local Authority partners, the Health Board has also commissioned a comprehensive review of the CHC fees (Laing and Buisson) to ensure the fee structure supports the short, medium and long term financial sustainability of Providers. The outcome of this review is expected later in this financial year and will inform the fee setting structure and approach for the financial year 2023/2024, at which point an engagement exercise with Providers will take place.

In the meantime, the Board will be pleased to note the ongoing support for Providers across the Health Board area, and the recommended uplifts, which take into account the Real Living Wage requirements set by Welsh Government.

# Welsh Ambulance Services NHS Trust (WAST)

Members are advised that at its July 2022 Board meeting, the WAST Trust Board will discuss the growing number of cases of avoidable harm or death to patients as a result of the sustained and extreme pressure across the Welsh NHS urgent and emergency care system, and substantial growth in handover lost hours.

Following discussion at WAST Assurance committees, including their Quality, Patient Experience and Safety Committee, the People and Culture Committee, and the Finance and Performance Committee, the concerns were escalated to the Trust Board and to the UHB as a stakeholder.

Actions taken by WAST to mitigate avoidable patient harm and death and improve the workplace experience are being presented to the WAST Trust Board on 28<sup>th</sup> July 2022. These include the system actions agreed following various meetings with NHS Wales Chairs, Chief Executives, Emergency Ambulance Services Committee, Director General of Health and Social Services and NHS Wales Chief Executive, and with the Minister for Health and Social Services.

It is proposed that this matter will be discussed at the Quality, Safety & Experience Committee meeting in August 2022.

#### **Petitions Committee**

As I advised in my last Board Report, there was a Petition logged in relation to our Strategy: Save A&E. Withybush General Hospital must retain 24 hour, 7 days a week, Consultant Led urgent care. The Petition closed on 18<sup>th</sup> May 2022 and was considered by the Petitions Committee on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2022, by which time it had collected 11,168 signatures (10,678 electronic signatures and 490 signatures on paper).

The Petitions Committee agreed that as the Petition had collected over 10,000 signatures it would be debated in the Senedd Chamber. The debate took place on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2022, led by the Chair of the Petitions Committee, with contributions from local constituency Members of the Senedd: Paul Davies (Member of the Senedd for Preseli and North Pembrokeshire); Samuel Kurtz (Member of the Senedd for ); Cefin Campbell (Regional Member of the Senedd); and Jane Dodds (Regional Member of the Senedd). The Minister for Health and Social Services responded on behalf of the Welsh Government. The Senedd agreed the motion to note the Petition.

On 12<sup>th</sup> July 2022, the Petitions Committee had been provided with additional evidence from the petitioner, and there was a further discussion. The Chair referred to the petition having 11,168 signatures that led to the Plenary Debate on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2022, led by local and regional Members in the Chamber, and thanked the petitioner and the signatories; the Petition was then closed.

### A Regional Collaboration for Health (ARCH): Swansea Bay City Deal

Members are advised that an Agreement dated 29<sup>th</sup> August 2018 between Carmarthenshire County Council (1) Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council (2) Pembrokeshire County Council (3) and the City and County of Swansea (4) established the Swansea Bay City Region Joint Committee for a term of 15 years from 29<sup>th</sup> August 2018. Carmarthenshire County Council was appointed as the Accountable Body responsible for the obligations set out in the Agreement.

The UHB is a co-opted partner on the Joint Committee and is also able to be co-opted onto the Programme Board as a non-voting member, and has committed to an annual payment of £50k for 2018/19, 2019/20, 2020/21, 20121/22 and 2022/23 (5 years) to support Swansea Bay City Deal. The same obligation is placed on other co-opted partners (Swansea University, University of Wales Trinity St David and Swansea Bay UHB).

I consider and recommend that we continue this relationship as it ensures our close partnership with the Swansea Bay City Deal and supports the UHB's Programme Business Case and the Pentre Awel development in Llanelli.

Carmarthenshire County Council has requested that the UHB signs a letter of commitment to support this arrangement and I am seeking Members' agreement to the final payment of £50k for 2022/23.

# Update on the Joint Executive Team Meeting: 13th July 2021

Pre-COVID-19, members of the Executive Team and I met bi-annually with the Chief Executive NHS Wales and members of his senior team as a Joint Executive Team (JET). These meetings have resumed by Teams virtually, with the most recent end of year meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2022.

As always, I was pleased with the level of discussion at the meeting and my team valued the opportunity to discuss progress and challenges on their areas of responsibility, and appreciated the feedback from the Health & Social Services Group's Executive Team.

It was acknowledged that the impact of COVID-19 continued to be felt across the UHB in 2021/22, with waves of COVID infections in our community and hospitals, resulting in unprecedented pressures in the UHB's Urgent and Emergency Care system. However, despite and because of this, the UHB has driven forward a number of changes, including being the first in Wales to introduce direct admissions from the ambulance service to our Same Day Emergency Care teams, and working in partnership with WAST to deliver the Physician Triage Assessment and Streaming (PTAS) model.

The meeting focused on 2021/22 and the UHB provided information about its year-end performance, with an acknowledgement that performance at year-end was not where the UHB wanted it to be, providing assurance that the position had improved since that time. The UHB's ambition was recognised, and it was accepted that all NHS Wales organisations were in similar situations but the UHB needed to focus on a consistent approach across all specialities.

The meeting included a detailed and helpful discussion about quality and safety, with a recognition of the work undertaken nationally by Executives in this area and a confidence in the UHB's focus. The UHB provided assurance that it is undertaking a bespoke review of pressure damage to consider its approach, as well as focusing on hospital acquired infections that remain a challenge. There was a discussion about the importance of ensuring that patient outcome and experience reflected the positive strategic work, and assurance provided that the UHB was on a journey in measuring the impact on patient experiences, as this was recognised as an important indicator of safe services.

The discussion on the innovative schemes in workforce and organisation development was positive, with our Grown Your Own model now being replicated across NHS Wales.

In summary, it was acknowledged that 2021/22 was another challenging year for the UHB but despite this, a number of important milestones had been achieved. There continued to be challenges ahead for all NHS Wales bodies, but the UHB had particular challenges in responding and delivering on its waiting list backlog, delivering a three-year plan and its financial position. Welsh Government wanted to work alongside the UHB to support these areas.
